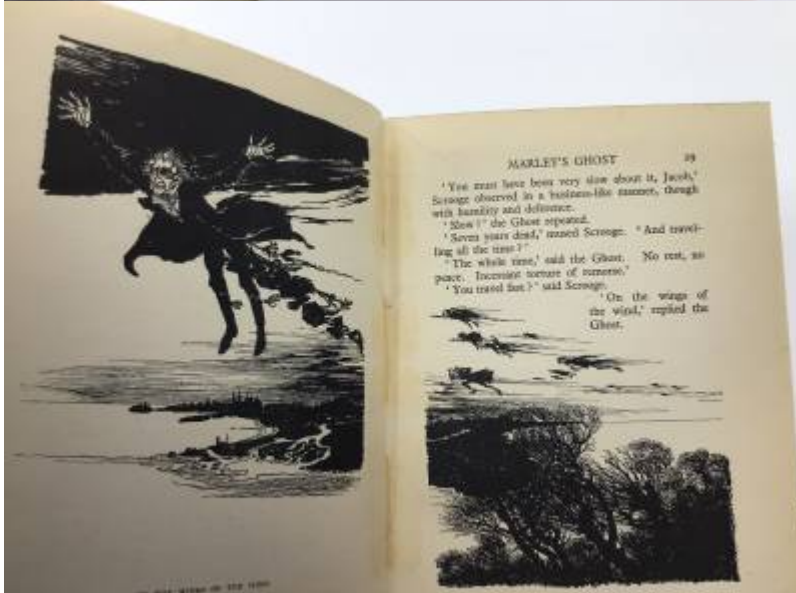
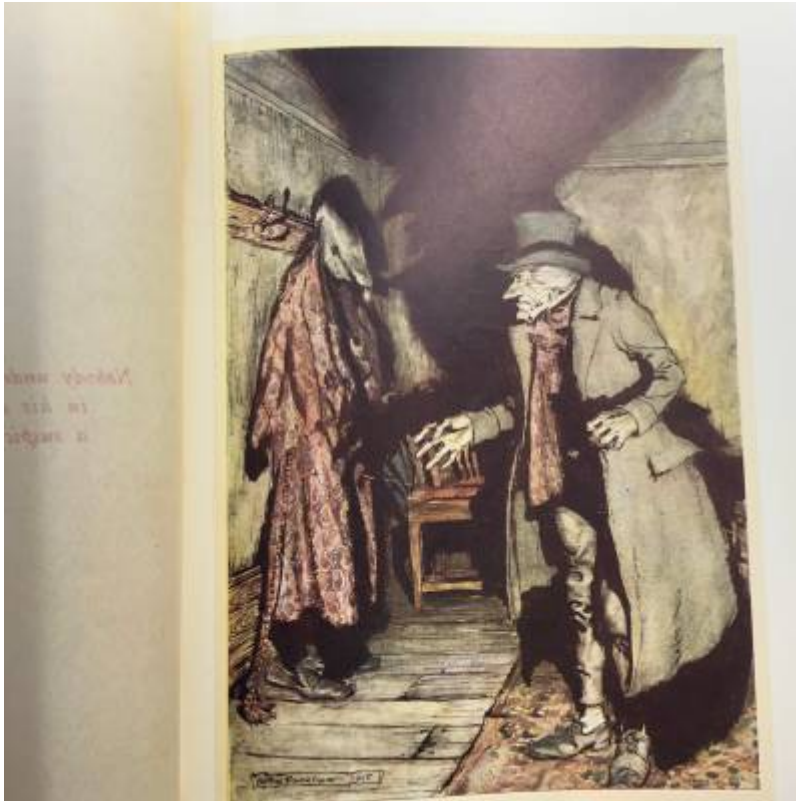


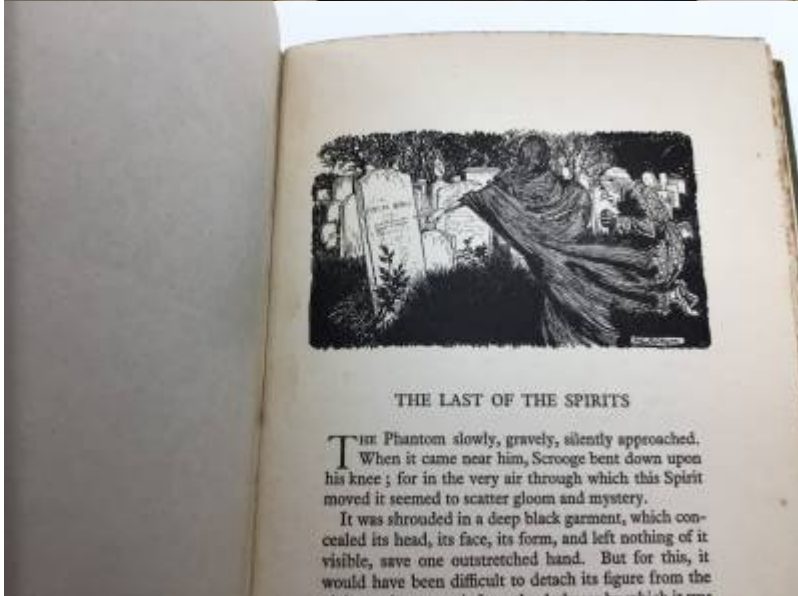
MARLEY'S GHOST

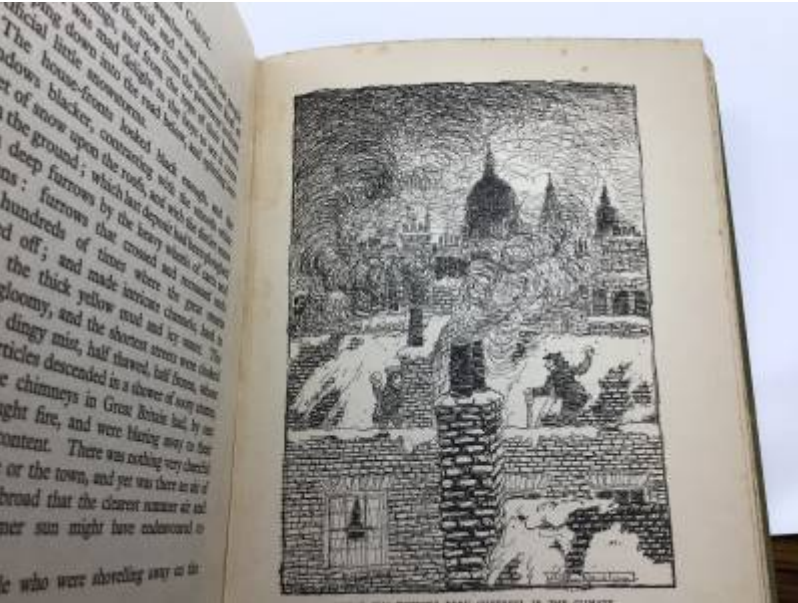


THE LAST OF THE SPIRITS

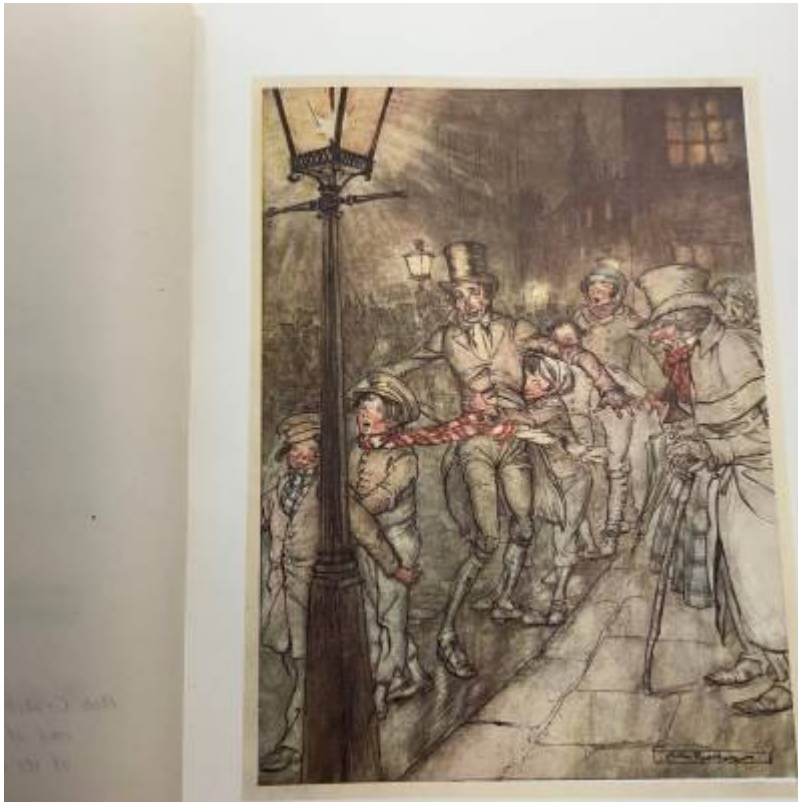
